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# CHAPTER ONE

## PHARMAKEIA PORTALS

### CORE BIBLICAL THEME

This chapter centers on the danger of seeking spiritual access, healing, enlightenment, or transformation apart from God. The cited Scriptures emphasize that counterfeit spiritual pathways lead to deception, while true life, authority, and access belong to God alone through Jesus Christ.

## CHAPTER TWELVE

This chapter emphasizes that believers are called to seek God through Jesus Christ alone rather than attempting to “redeem” practices rooted in occultism, manipulation, or counterfeit spirituality. The cited Scriptures warn against mixing truth with deception and affirm that Christ alone is the sufficient mediator between God and humanity.

# CHAPTER THIRTEEN

## EDEN RESTORED
