CHAPTER ONE

CHOOSE GOD

CORE BIBLICAL THEME

Choosing God begins a lifelong journey of hearing His voice, responding with obedience, and growing in relationship through humility, faith, and surrender. This relationship is marked by recognizing His voice, following His direction, and living with childlike faith.

SCRIPTURE USED IN THIS CHAPTER

- John 14:6
- Acts 23:11
- Acts 22:17–21
- Acts 1:1
- John 14:9
- 2 Timothy 1:6
- 2 Peter 1:13
- Matthew 18:1–4

BIBLICAL INSIGHT

These Scriptures reveal that Jesus is central to hearing God’s voice and living in His ways. He is “the way,” and through Him, believers are taught, led, and instructed. God speaks clearly, gives direction, and expects obedience. Spiritual growth involves both doing and learning, as modeled by Jesus. Believers are called to stir up what God has given them and walk in humility like a child—dependent, responsive, and trusting. This posture allows them to recognize and follow God’s voice.

REFLECTION QUESTIONS

1. According to John 10:3–5 and Matthew 18:1–4, what does it mean to hear and follow God’s voice with childlike faith?
2. In Acts 22:17–21, how did Paul respond when God spoke to him, even when he had questions?

3. What do Acts 1:1 and John 14:6 reveal about how Jesus teaches and leads His followers?
4. How do 2 Timothy 1:6 and 2 Peter 1:13 challenge you to actively engage what God has placed within you?
5. Where in your life might pride or fear be limiting your willingness to obey God's voice?

GROUP DISCUSSION

1. What does "becoming like a child" (Matthew 18:1–4) look like in practical, everyday faith?
2. How can we discern between God's voice and our own thoughts based on the examples in Acts?
3. Why is it important that Jesus both "did and taught" (Acts 1:1)? How should that shape our lives?
4. What does it look like to "stir up the gift of God" (2 Timothy 1:6) in community?
5. How can a group encourage one another to walk in humility and obedience to God's voice?

PRAYER & SPIRITUAL ACTIVATION

Prayer

Father God, I choose You. I thank You that You speak, lead, and reveal Your ways through Jesus. Teach me to recognize Your voice and follow You with humility and trust. Remove pride, fear, and doubt from my heart, and give me a childlike faith that responds quickly to You. Help me to stir up what You have placed within me and walk in obedience to Your direction. Let my life reflect Your ways so that others may see You through me. I surrender my heart, my thoughts, and my future to You. Speak, Lord—I am listening.

Activation Step

Set aside time today to quietly ask God to speak to you. Write down the first thought, impression, or Scripture that comes to mind, and reflect on how it aligns with the verses in this chapter.

CHAPTER TWO

YOU ARE A WITNESS

CORE BIBLICAL THEME

Believers are empowered by the Holy Spirit to be witnesses of God's truth, hearing His voice and responding in faith to share His message with others.

SCRIPTURE USED IN THIS CHAPTER

- Job 22:28
- Revelation 12:10
- Revelation 21:17
- John 10:3–5
- 1 Corinthians 14:31

BIBLICAL INSIGHT

These Scriptures emphasize that the Holy Spirit empowers believers to witness, speak, and act according to God's will. God's voice is known by His people, and all believers can participate in sharing His truth. Spiritual gifts, including prophecy, are given by grace—not earned—and are meant to strengthen, encourage, and bring others into relationship with God. Love is the founda-

tion for all spiritual expression, and hearing God's voice flows from knowing Him. Being a witness is not optional but central to the Christian life, empowered by the Spirit.

REFLECTION QUESTIONS

1. According to Acts 1:8, what is the purpose of receiving the Holy Spirit?
2. How do John 10:3–5 and John 10:27 shape your understanding of hearing God's voice?
3. What does 1 Corinthians 14:31 teach about who can prophesy and why?
4. How do Ephesians 2:8–9 and Romans 11:29 influence your view of spiritual gifts?
5. Why is love essential in exercising spiritual gifts according to 1 Corinthians 13:8 and 14:1?

GROUP DISCUSSION

1. What does it practically look like to be a "witness" (Acts 1:8) in everyday life?

PRAYER & SPIRITUAL ACTIVATION

Prayer

Father God, thank You for giving me Your Holy Spirit and calling me to be Your witness. Help me to hear Your voice clearly and to trust what You speak. Remove fear, doubt, and hesitation, and fill me with boldness to share Your truth with love. Teach me to walk in Your grace, knowing that Your gifts are given freely. Let my words strengthen, encourage, and bring life to others. Align my heart with Yours so that everything I say and do reflects Your love and Your purpose.

Activation Step

Reach out to one person today and share a simple word of encouragement or truth you feel God is placing on your heart, trusting Him to work through you.

CHAPTER THREE

THE THOUGHTS OF GOD

CORE BIBLICAL THEME

God communicates His thoughts to believers through the Holy Spirit, enabling them to understand, receive, and share what He reveals.

SCRIPTURE USED IN THIS CHAPTER

- 1 Corinthians 2:9–16
- Matthew 7:9–11 (*referenced concept: asking for bread, not a stone*)
- Acts 12:5–16 (*referenced through Peter's deliverance account*)

BIBLICAL INSIGHT

These Scriptures reveal that God's thoughts are made known through the Holy Spirit. What cannot be understood naturally is revealed spiritually. Believers have access to the mind of God, not through human reasoning, but through the Spirit. God responds when His people ask, giving what is good and life-giving. Even when faith feels weak or uncertain, God works through what is offered to Him. Spiritual understanding grows as believers trust, listen, and act on what God reveals.

REFLECTION QUESTIONS

1. According to 1 Corinthians 2:9–16, how does the Holy Spirit reveal the thoughts of God?
2. What does it mean to “have the mind of Christ” based on these verses?
3. How does the principle of asking and receiving (Matthew 7:9–11) shape your expectation when seeking God's voice?
4. In Acts 12:5–16, what does this story reveal about how God works even when belief is imperfect?
5. How can you grow in recognizing whether a thought is from God?

GROUP DISCUSSION

1. Why do believers often dismiss thoughts that may actually be from God?
2. How can we create space to better hear the Holy Spirit in daily life?
3. What role does faith play when stepping out to share what we believe God has spoken?
4. How can a group encourage one another to trust and act on God-given impressions?
5. What are practical ways to test and confirm that a thought aligns with God's truth?

PRAYER & SPIRITUAL ACTIVATION

Prayer

Father God, thank You that Your thoughts are not hidden from me but revealed through Your Spirit. Teach me to recognize Your voice within my thoughts and to trust what You are speaking. Remove doubt and fear that cause me to hesitate, and replace them with confidence in Your truth. Help me to receive what You freely give and to share it with others in love. Open my heart and mind to understand Your ways more deeply, and guide me as I walk in step with Your Spirit.

Activation Step

Take a few quiet minutes and ask God to give you one thought or impression for someone you know. Write it down, then share it with that person as encouragement.

CHAPTER FOUR

GOD REVEALS MYSTERIES THROUGH PICTURES

CORE BIBLICAL THEME

God reveals His truth and communicates His messages through spiritual vision and imagery, which are understood through the Holy Spirit.

SCRIPTURE USED IN THIS CHAPTER

- Habakkuk 2:2
- Acts 2:17
- Amos 3:7
- Numbers 12:6

BIBLICAL INSIGHT

These Scriptures show that God reveals His plans and messages through visions, dreams, and prophetic insight. He communicates in ways that require spiritual perception and understanding. God speaks to His people through revelation, often using pictures and imagery that must be discerned through the Spirit. This form of communication is intentional and consistent with how He has spoken throughout Scripture.

REFLECTION QUESTIONS

1. According to Acts 2:17, how does God communicate with His people in the last days?
2. What does Amos 3:7 reveal about how God shares His plans?
3. How does Numbers 12:6 describe the way God speaks through visions and dreams?
4. Why is it important to “write the vision” as instructed in Habakkuk 2:2?
5. How can you grow in recognizing and understanding spiritual pictures from God?

GROUP DISCUSSION

1. Why do you think God often uses pictures, dreams, or visions instead of only words?
2. How can we test whether a vision or impression is from God?
3. What challenges do people face when trying to interpret spiritual imagery?
4. How can a group help each other grow in discernment of God's voice?
5. What role does Scripture play in confirming prophetic impressions?

PRAYER & SPIRITUAL ACTIVATION

Prayer

Father God, thank You that You reveal Your heart and Your plans to Your people. Open my eyes to see what You are showing me and my heart to understand it through Your Spirit. Teach me to recognize the ways You speak, whether through pictures, dreams, or impressions. Give me wisdom and discernment to interpret what You reveal, and help me to respond in obedience. Let Your voice become clearer to me as I grow in relationship with You.

Activation Step

Ask God to show you a simple picture or image for someone you know. Write down what you see and ask Him for understanding, then share it as encouragement.

CHAPTER FIVE

GOD ORCHESTRATES OUR LIVES

CORE BIBLICAL THEME

God actively directs and orders the lives of His people, guiding their steps and working through circumstances to accomplish His purposes.

SCRIPTURE USED IN THIS CHAPTER

- Proverbs 3:5–6
- Psalm 37:23
- Romans 8:28

BIBLICAL INSIGHT

These Scriptures reveal that God is intimately involved in guiding the lives of believers. Trusting Him fully allows Him to direct paths and establish steps. Even when circumstances are unclear or difficult, God is working all things together for good according to His purpose. His guidance is not random but intentional, leading toward His plans.

REFLECTION QUESTIONS

1. According to Proverbs 3:5–6, what does it mean to trust God instead of relying on your own understanding?
2. How does Psalm 37:23 describe God’s involvement in your daily steps?
3. What assurance does Romans 8:28 give about difficult or confusing situations?
4. Where in your life do you struggle to trust God’s direction?
5. How can you become more aware of God orchestrating your circumstances?

GROUP DISCUSSION

1. What are practical ways to trust God when His direction is unclear?
2. How have you seen God work through circumstances in your life?

PRAYER & SPIRITUAL ACTIVATION

Prayer

Father God, I trust You with my life. Teach me to rely on You and not on my own understanding. Direct my steps and guide my decisions according to Your will. Help me to see Your hand at work in every situation, even when I do not understand. Strengthen my faith to believe that You are working all things for good. I surrender my plans to You and ask that Your purposes be fulfilled in my life.

Activation Step

Identify one area of your life where you need direction. Pray and surrender it to God, then take one step of obedience based on what you believe He is leading you to do.

CHAPTER SIX

GOD GIVES US VALUE

CORE BIBLICAL THEME

God establishes the value and identity of every believer, affirming their worth through His perspective rather than human opinion.

SCRIPTURE USED IN THIS CHAPTER

- Matthew 10:29–31
- Psalm 139:13–14
- Ephesians 2:10

BIBLICAL INSIGHT

These Scriptures reveal that God deeply values each person. He is aware of every detail of life, and nothing about us is overlooked. We are intentionally created by Him, formed with purpose, and designed for good works. Our value is not determined by others or circumstances but by God's creation and calling. Recognizing this truth allows believers to live with confidence and purpose.

REFLECTION QUESTIONS

1. According to Matthew 10:29–31, what does God's care for even the smallest details reveal about your value?
2. How does Psalm 139:13–14 shape your understanding of how God created you?
3. What does Ephesians 2:10 say about your purpose and identity?
4. In what ways have you allowed others or circumstances to define your value?
5. How can you begin to see yourself the way God sees you?

GROUP DISCUSSION

1. Why do people often struggle to believe they have value?

2. How can understanding God's perspective change the way we see ourselves and others?
3. What does it look like to live confidently in the identity God has given?

5. What practical steps can help shift identity from self-perception to God's truth?

PRAYER & SPIRITUAL ACTIVATION

Prayer

Father God, thank You that my value comes from You. You created me with purpose and intention, and nothing about me is accidental. Help me to see myself through Your eyes and to reject any false beliefs about my worth. Remind me that I am Your workmanship, created for Your purposes. Strengthen my identity in You so that I can live with confidence, humility, and purpose. Let Your truth define me and guide my life.

Activation Step

Write down one truth about your identity based on Scripture from this chapter and declare it over yourself daily this week.

CHAPTER SEVEN

JUST GO FOR IT

CORE BIBLICAL THEME

Faith requires action—believers are called to step out in obedience, trusting God to work through them even when they feel uncertain.

SCRIPTURE USED IN THIS CHAPTER

- Matthew 14:28–29
- James 2:17
- 2 Corinthians 5:7

BIBLICAL INSIGHT

These Scriptures show that faith is not passive but active. Peter stepping out of the boat demonstrates that obedience often begins before full understanding or confidence. Faith without action is incomplete, and believers are called to walk by faith rather than by sight. God responds to those who move forward in trust, even when the outcome is not fully visible.

REFLECTION QUESTIONS

1. What does Matthew 14:28–29 teach about stepping out in faith?
2. According to James 2:17, why is action essential to faith?
3. How does 2 Corinthians 5:7 challenge you to trust God beyond what you can see?
4. What fears or doubts have held you back from acting on what you believe God is saying?

CHAPTER EIGHT

LEARN THE LANGUAGE OF A LOVING FATHER

CORE BIBLICAL THEME

God speaks to His people in a language rooted in love, and learning to recognize His voice requires understanding His heart and character.

SCRIPTURE USED IN THIS CHAPTER

- John 10:27
- Romans 8:15
- 1 Corinthians 14:3

BIBLICAL INSIGHT

These Scriptures reveal that God's voice is relational and rooted in love. As His children, believers are invited into a close relationship where they can hear and recognize His voice. The Holy Spirit confirms this relationship, allowing believers to approach God as Father. His communication builds up, encourages, and brings comfort, reflecting His loving nature. Draw me closer to You so that I can hear You more clearly and follow You more faithfully. Teach me to trust Your voice and reflect Your love when I speak to others. Let my heart be aligned with Yours so that everything I hear and share comes from Your love.

Activation Step

Take time today to quietly listen for God's voice, focusing on His love. Write down what you sense He is saying and reflect on how it aligns with His character.

CHAPTER NINE

SPEAK BLESSINGS

CORE BIBLICAL THEME

Believers are called to use their words to release blessing, life, and encouragement, reflecting God's heart through what they speak.

SCRIPTURE USED IN THIS CHAPTER

- Proverbs 18:21
- Numbers 6:24–26
- Romans 12:14

BIBLICAL INSIGHT

Speak a specific blessing over at least one person today—either in person, by message, or in prayer—and observe how it impacts them.

CHAPTER TEN

PROPHECY BEFORE TIME

CORE BIBLICAL THEME

God declares and reveals His purposes before they happen, inviting believers to trust His voice and align with His timing and plans.

SCRIPTURE USED IN THIS CHAPTER

- Isaiah 46:9–10
- Amos 3:7
- 1 Corinthians 14:3

BIBLICAL INSIGHT

These Scriptures show that God knows the end from the beginning and reveals His plans ahead of time. He communicates His intentions so that His people can align with His purposes. Prophecy is not random but intentional, designed to strengthen, encourage, and guide. Trusting God's voice means believing that what He speaks will come to pass according to His timing.

REFLECTION QUESTIONS

1. According to Isaiah 46:9–10, what does it mean that God declares the end from the beginning?

Give me patience and faith to walk in alignment with Your timing. Strengthen my heart to remain steady and focused on You, not just on the promises. Teach me to trust Your voice and to live in obedience to Your direction.

Activation Step

Write down one promise or word you believe God has spoken to you, and spend time praying over it, choosing to trust His timing rather than your own.

CHAPTER ELEVEN

NEVER STOP CULTIVATING YOUR RELATIONSHIP WITH GOD

CORE BIBLICAL THEME

A continual, growing relationship with God is essential for hearing His voice, remaining spiritually fruitful, and walking in His purposes.

SCRIPTURE USED IN THIS CHAPTER

BIBLICAL INSIGHT

Activation Step

Set aside intentional time today to be with God—free from distractions—and focus on simply being in His presence and listening.

CHAPTER TWELVE

ONE WORD CAN CHANGE A LIFE FOREVER

CORE BIBLICAL THEME

A single word from God carries the power to transform a life, bringing direction, hope, and lasting impact.

SCRIPTURE USED IN THIS CHAPTER

- Proverbs 25:11
- Isaiah 55:11
- 1 Corinthians 14:3

BIBLICAL INSIGHT

These Scriptures reveal the power and precision of God's words. When spoken at the right time, they bring life, clarity, and transformation. God's word never returns empty but accomplishes His purpose. Prophetic words are meant to strengthen, encourage, and comfort, carrying lasting impact far beyond the moment they are spoken.

REFLECTION QUESTIONS
